In 1948, the photographer and co-founder of Magnum Photos, George Rodger, learned of the Nuba and Latuka tribes in the Kordofan region of the Sudan. Remarkably, the Sudanese government granted him permission to photograph the people, who lived as their ancestors had done for centuries before them.

Rodger's exquisite, softly coloured Kodachrome and Ekatchome photographs offer a glimpse into another world, now lost to time.

The black and white photographs of the same subjects, shot at the same time, were collected and published in the landmark Village of the Nuba book in 1955, with images from the series quickly becoming recognised as classics. Several of these black and white photographs are included in the Serena Morton exhibiton.
